Ganesh Visarjan 2024: Overview and Timing

Ganesh Visarjan marks the poignant conclusion of the Ganesh Chaturthi festival, during which devotees bid farewell to Lord Ganesha. This significant event involves immersing the idol of Lord Ganesha in water bodies after ten days of dedicated worship. Ganesh Visarjan falls on Anant Chaturdashi during Shukla Paksha in Bhadrapada, and this year, it will be observed on September 17, 2024.

Key Details for Ganesh Visarjan 2024:

• Chaturdashi Tithi: Begins on September 16, 2024, at 3:10 PM and ends on September 17, 2024, at 11:44 AM.

- Morning: September 17, 2024, from 08:38 AM to 01:13 PM
- Afternoon: September 17, 2024, from 02:44 PM to 04:16 PM
- Evening: September 17, 2024, from 07:16 PM to 08:44 PM
- Night: September 17, 2024, from 10:13 PM to September 18, 2024, 02:38 AM

Importance and Rituals: Ganesh Visarjan is a revered tradition where devotees immerse the Ganesh idol in water bodies, signifying a heartfelt farewell to the deity. The rituals include cleaning the home, inviting loved ones, preparing special dishes, and performing puja and aarti with devotion. The process involves a grand procession with chants, music, and dance, followed by the immersion of the idol and distribution of food to the needy. This day is celebrated with enthusiasm and reverence, ensuring that Lord Ganesha blesses his devotees with happiness, love, and prosperity.



BMC's Preparations for Eco-Friendly Ganesh Visarjan 2024

As Ganeshotsav concludes, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has laid out extensive plans to ensure a safe and eco-friendly Ganesh Visarjan on September 17, 2024.

Key Measures:

- Control Rooms and Staff: 71 control rooms will oversee 12,000 staff members deployed across the city. Additionally, 66 observation towers have been set up to enhance security.
- Beach Safety: At Girgaon Chowpatty, 478 steel plates and 43 tarpaulins will be used to prevent vehicle sinkage. Safety measures include 761 lifeguards and 48 motorboats stationed at beaches.
- Floral Offerings: 163 Nirmalya Kalashas and 274 vehicles will be utilized to collect floral offerings. Furthermore, 75 first aid centers and 67 ambulances will be available for emergencies, with warnings about jellyfish along the coast.

Eco-Friendly Initiatives:

Artificial Ponds: 204 artificial ponds have been set up alongside 69 natural immersion sites. Devotees can find these artificial ponds through a QR code system, which links to Google Maps for easy navigation. This initiative aims to minimize environmental impact by promoting the use of artificial ponds for idol immersion.

Ganeshotsav 2024 Mumbai Traffic Guidelines

- South Mumbai: Use Chatrapati Sambhaji Maharaj Coastal Road for smoother travel between North and South Mumbai.
- Marine Drive: Traffic from Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Road diverted to Coastal Road.
- Azad Maidan: No vehicular movement on Mahapalika Marg from CSMT Junction to Vasudev Balawant Fadake Chowk. Use D.N. Road and L.T. Marg.
- Kalbadevi: Prohibited roads include J.S.S. Road, Vitthalbhai Patel Road, Baba Saheb Jaykar Road, and others. No parking on these roads.
- Pydhonie: Closed roads include Jinabhai Mulji Rathod Marg and P.D. Mello Road. No parking on specified roads.
- D B Marg: Prohibited roads include N.S. Road and Dadasaheb Bhadkamkar Marg. One-way traffic on Walkeshwar Road. No parking on JSS Road, D.B. Marg, and others.
- Nagpada: Prohibited roads include N.M. Joshi Marg and B. J. Marg. No parking on specified roads.

Traffic Diversions:

Dr. B.A. Road: Northbound closure from Hansraj Rathod Chowk to Comrade Krishna Desai Chowk. Southbound closure from Comrade Krishna Desai Chowk to Hansraj Rathod Chowk. Use Lalbaugh flyover or alternative routes. **Sane Guruji Marg:** Closure from Comrade Ganacharya Junction to Saint Jagnade Maharaj Chowk. Use N.M. Joshi Road.

Govindaji Keni Marg: Closure from Mane Master Chowk to Hind Mata Junction. Use B.J. Devrukhakar Marg.

Mumbai Marathi Granth Sangrahalaya Marg: One-way from Ranjit Budhakar Chowk to Sarfare Chowk. Use G.D. Ambekar Road.

King E. D. Road: One-way from Parel T.T. to Khanolkar Chowk. Use Dr. E. Borges Marg.

Worli Traffic Division:

One-Way Restrictions: Dr. Annie Besant Road southbound traffic diverted. **No Parking Zones:** Dr. Annie Besant Road, R. G. Thadani Road, N. M. Joshi Marg.

Dadar Traffic Division:

Alternative Routes: Use Swatantraveer Savarkar Marg, Pandurang Naik Marg, and other specified routes.

Advice:

- Avoid restricted areas unless necessary.
- Use alternate routes like Lalbaugh flyover, Coastal Road, and Sir J. J. Bridge.
- Traffic management teams will ensure smooth operations and public safety.
