INDIA UPDATE

Highlights of this week

Andhra Pradesh

- The Centre has sanctioned ₹50 crore for Municipal Shared Service Centres, releasing the first ₹25 crore to modernise urban governance with tech-driven reforms in land, water, energy, and citizen services, positioning the state as a leader in municipal transformation.
- AP prioritises hydel power for stable electricity, with Chief Secretary K Vijayanand directing APGENCO to coordinate with renewable and thermal sources. Since July 2025, hydel generation has averaged 15.5 MUs per day, ensuring reliable supply.

Delhi

- The MCD approved road and drain works, land allotment for the Inderprastha-Inderlok Metro, and extended the SUNIYO property tax scheme. Landfill reclamation projects in Ghazipur, Bhalawa, and Okhla were also sanctioned.
- CM Rekha Gupta inaugurated projects including a 100-TPD CBG plant, a CBG-CNG fuel station, a 25kW solar rooftop, and a new fire station, also laying a grid substation foundation. These developments aim to boost safety, and reliable power supply.
- Delhi's pet dog reforms, including free registration and vaccinations, remain unenforced due to pending approvals from civic agencies. Compliance is low, and regulatory implementation is delayed by lengthy bureaucratic processes.

Goa

- Goa's 2025–26 tourism season gains momentum with increased Russian charters and new European markets. Rising FIT arrivals and government incentives promise a stronger, steadier visitor turnout.
- Goa Assembly reconstitutes key House Committees on Mhadei river diversion and common burial ground. New chairpersons Subhash Shirodkar and Mauvin Godinho will lead efforts on these sensitive environmental and cultural issues.

Gujarat

- Gujarat SGST uncovers ₹52.07 crore tax evasion in the food and restaurant sector under the GST Composition Scheme, involving fake QR codes and underreported sales. Legal action and recovery of ₹4.88 crore in taxes, interest, and penalties have been initiated.
- Gujarat govt approves splitting Banaskantha, creating Vav-Tharad district to improve administration and accessibility. Palanpur remains Banaskantha HQ, while Tharad heads the new district with eight talukas.

Haryana

- CM Saini appoints senior officials in each district to address farmers issues and ensure smooth paddy procurement, with an online portal tracking fair compensation. Digital weighing machines are being installed to streamline operations despite moisture concerns.
- Haryana launches new policy to regularise water and sewer connections in municipal areas, including villages, with residents paying nominal fees plus prevailing charges. Consumers bear material and labour costs for installation.

Himachal Pradesh

- Himachal Pradesh launches PEHEL scheme with Rs 294.36 crore to support 40,000 shepherd families and promote livestock. Milk incentives and poultry development will further boost rural income and employment.
- Ludhiana and Shimla are among eight cities selected for integrated state and city logistics plans to boost efficiency and cut costs. The DPIIT and ADB will streamline freight, supply chains, and last-mile delivery nationwide.

Karnataka

- Karnataka CM Siddaramaiah ruled out extending the caste survey deadline of October 7, urging officials to accelerate progress. Technical glitches have been resolved, and daily coverage targets of at least 10% have been set.
- Karnataka govt released Rs 60.36 crore for 1.2 lakh caste survey enumerators, with Rs 5,000 each as first instalment. Supervisors will receive Rs 10,000, and payments will be disbursed in stages.

Upcoming News/Events

Andhra Pradesh

- A high alert has been issued in coastal Andhra Pradesh as a Bay of Bengal depression brings heavy rains, prompting authorities to activate control rooms, deploy NDRF/SDRF teams, and advise fishermen and residents to avoid seas, flooded areas, and unsafe structures.
- The Indian Navy will commission INS Androth on October 6 in Visakhapatnam, boosting coastal defence and anti-submarine capabilities. The vessel is over 80% indigenous, reflecting India's focus on defence self-reliance.

Delhi

- Delhi plans to re-tile Yamuna ghats at Asita and Vasudev despite recent inundation, with experts attributing damage to river backflow from floodplain encroachment. The work aims to repair submerged infrastructure and landscaping washed away by receding waters.
- PWD plans three new foot over bridges at high-traffic spots on Pankha Road and Uttam Nagar to improve pedestrian safety, with surveys and feasibility studies already underway. The project includes detailed traffic counts and topographic assessments for approval.
- CM Rekha Gupta revives Ladli scheme for 40,000 beneficiaries and urges LG to fast-track Master Plan 2041, stressing long-term development solutions. She also inaugurated 81 rural projects under Dilli Gramodaya Abhiyan across 50 villages.

Goa

- Goa Shipyard Ltd posts record FY 2024-25 revenue of Rs 3,190 crore with profits of Rs 288 crore and an order book over Rs 16,000 crore. The upcoming Rs 18,000 crore Navy corvette deal could nearly double orders to Rs 34,000 crore.
- NGT directs GCZMA to publish full details of all illegal coastal structures in Goa online, covering complaints since January 2019. The move aims to enhance transparency, accountability, and citizen monitoring of CRZ violations.

Gujarat

- AMC mandates police verification and society NOC for all PG accommodations, issuing notices to 385 operators and warning of legal action or eviction for non-compliance. The move aims to enhance security and reduce disputes between PG tenants and residents.
- Gujarat govt assigns four municipal corporations to supervise cleanliness in 20 municipalities, covering waste management, toilets, and health. The initiative includes 100 days of training to improve hygiene.

Haryana

- Rohtak's drinking water and drainage projects worth Rs 443 crore await government approval, with MLA Batra urging CM Saini to sanction funds for timely execution. Residents face contaminated water and overflowing sewage due to dilapidated pipelines.
- Panipat will receive 40 new electric buses by October-end to reduce pollution and ease traffic, expanding the existing city bus service. The e-buses will cover local and nearby district routes, boosting commuter convenience.

Himachal Pradesh

- Himachal Pradesh will provide high-speed broadband to 3,615 panchayats and Internet access to 15,538 villages via optical fiber under the Bharat Net plan. The Rs 500 crore 4G Saturation Plan also supports connectivity in remote areas.
- PWD begins work on a new Bailey bridge in Old Manali to restore the flood-damaged Club House–Palchan road. The Rs 40 lakh modular bridge aims to resume traffic in 1–2 days, aiding locals and tourism.

Karnataka

- Karnataka approves State Skill Development Policy 2025-32 with a Rs 4,432.5 crore budget. It aims to unify skilling initiatives, enhance workforce readiness, and promote inclusivity and global mobility.
- Karnataka urges farmers to lease land for the Kusum-C solar scheme, ensuring stable income and reliable daytime electricity for agricultural pump-sets. The government provides support, but land shortages remain a challenge.



INDIA UPDATE

Highlights of this week

Madhya Pradesh

- Indore recorded 11.4 mm of rainfall with drizzle continuing throughout the day, pushing seasonal rainfall to 954.7 mm, 33 mm above average. The Met department forecasts unsettled weather until October 2, with heavy showers in surrounding areas.

Mumbai

- Maharashtra has disbursed ₹16,034 crore for crop losses between March 2023 and August 2025, including ₹2,215 crore recently approved after heavy rains. Opposition leaders demand transparency on how much compensation has actually reached farmers.
- Heavy rains across Maharashtra have led to massive water discharge from major dams, flooding parts of Marathwada and disrupting life in Mumbai. CM Devendra Fadnavis has directed evacuations along riverbanks as authorities stay on high alert.
- MMRDA has appointed a committee to review Reliance Infra's proposal for more non-fare revenue from Mumbai Metro 1, which faces ₹350 crore annual losses. The plan includes leasing depot space, expanding retail, and using metro pillars for ads.

Pune

- Ruby Hall Clinic launched a "Saving Lives Campaign" on World Heart Day, installing 20 AEDs across metro stations, malls, schools, and offices while training 1,000 citizens in CPR and AED use.
- Maha-Metro signed its first MoU with IIT-Kanpur on Sept 26 to strengthen cybersecurity for Pune and Nagpur metro systems, focusing on securing operations, signalling, telecom, and fare collection with global standards and real-time monitoring.
- Maharashtra government has merged 17 committees in private-aided schools into five key bodies to reduce teachers' administrative burden, ensuring more focus on students and mandating gender balance with 50% women members.

Punjab

- CAQM reviewed Punjab and Haryana's stubble burning plans, deploying flying squads and a monitoring cell in Mohali to enforce compliance. States must ensure CRM machinery, ex-situ residue use, and strict adherence during paddy harvesting.
- The Punjab Pollution Control Board has deployed over 10,500 staff to tackle farm fires, focusing on hotspot monitoring and strict enforcement. So far, 90 incidents have been reported, with FIRs and environmental penalties imposed on violators.

Rajasthan

- Rajasthan's expenditure has exceeded its revenues by over 16%, leading to a fiscal deficit of Rs 31,491 crore in 2023-24, largely driven by costly welfare schemes. Declining oil, gas, and property revenues have worsened the state's fiscal sustainability.

Tamil Nadu

- A stampede during Vijay's political rally in Karur left 40 dead and many injured due to crowd mismanagement, delays, and insufficient police presence. TVK leaders have not yet visited the victims or the injured.
- CM Stalin said 47,000 acres of barren land have been reclaimed for farming, with paddy sown on 5.66 lakh hectares this year. The Agri Business Festival 2025 provided farmers a platform to market produce and explore new opportunities.

Telangana

- CM Revanth Reddy announced a Rs 2,000 monthly stipend for students joining ATCs, with apprenticeship opportunities in TGSRTC. The state has completed 65 ATCs, sanctioned 51 more, and aims to enhance skill development for better employability.
- Telangana has granted 42% BC reservation in local bodies, raising the total quota to 67%, fulfilling a key election promise. The State Election Commission will review preparedness, with polls likely to be notified soon.

Uttar Pradesh

- CM Yogi Adityanath transferred ₹89.96 crore to 3.96 lakh students under scholarships, highlighting inclusivity through the New Education Policy. He also announced the upcoming 'One Nation, One Scholarship' system for seamless student access.
- PM Modi inaugurated the UP International Trade Show with Russia as the partner country, strengthening bilateral ties amid US tariff concerns. The five-day event showcases UP's crafts, industries, and MSMEs to thousands of exhibitors and visitors.

Upcoming News/Events

Madhya Pradesh

- Depalpur will be developed into a clean council within 100 days, following Indore's model, with a special focus on improving sanitation and civic management. MLA Manoj Patel has announced a ₹11 lakh cash prize for the cleanest ward to encourage participation.

Mumbai

- BMC will provide jobs, land, and compensation to 619 families displaced by the Gargai dam, resettling them on 400 hectares near Devli village in Wada taluka. Partial compensation will be given to residents of four other affected villages without relocation.
- CSMT's platform 18 will be closed from Oct 1 for around two months for redevelopment, including an elevated passenger deck to ease congestion and house amenities. Long-distance trains will be diverted to other platforms, with safety and essential services maintained.
- Uddhav Thackeray demanded a ₹50,000-crore relief package and blanket loan waiver from PM Modi for flood-hit Maharashtra, stressing urgent farmer compensation. He also criticised the Centre for not visiting affected areas despite massive losses.

Pune

- PMRDA will spend ₹628 crore to widen a 50-km stretch into a six-lane cement road parallel to Metro Line 3, aiming to improve connectivity, though activists warn it may encourage private vehicle use over public transport.
- PCMC has launched a green plan to plant native trees along road dividers and footpaths, ensuring their long-term care. The initiative aims to make Pimpri-Chinchwad greener and healthier.
- Pune district administration has begun land measurement for the Purandar International Airport project, with over 94% of farmers consenting peacefully. Around 2,810 acres from seven villages will be acquired, with fair compensation and rehabilitation measures in place.

Punjab

- Punjab will table two Bills to enhance urban infrastructure, allowing better use of improvement trust funds and ensuring planned colony development, unlocking idle properties for civic upgrades.
- The Punjab government will table two Bills to boost urban infrastructure, focusing on planned development and fund utilization. The amendments will allow improvement trust funds to be used across civic bodies and ensure systematic colony development.

Rajasthan

- The state government will open five new Sanskrit schools and upgrade eight others, expanding options for rural students. Currently, 1,814 schools educate over 1.26 lakh students, with upgrades allowing 975 to continue in their existing schools.

Tamil Nadu

- Tamil Nadu will not reconstitute the Waqf Board under the amended Act until the Supreme Court issues its final verdict, says Minister S M Nasar. The government aims to protect Muslim community rights while ensuring Waqf functions continue uninterrupted.
- TN will get 7,500 new indigenous 4G towers under BSNL's rollout, enhancing connectivity in urban and remote areas. PM Modi will inaugurate the system, already commissioned across 97,500 sites statewide.

Telangana

- CM Revanth Reddy announced a new Act to deduct 10% from Telangana government employees' salaries who neglect their parents, while also highlighting TGPSC reforms and criticizing the previous BRS government for neglecting youth employment.
- Telangana's new tourism policy aims to attract Rs 15,000 crore in investments and create around 50,000 jobs through public-private partnerships, with projects including luxury hotels, wellness centres, and resorts.

Uttar Pradesh

- UP excise department launches a university-focused drive to educate youth on addiction, partnering with NGOs for support. The campaign begins at Lucknow University and will expand to other major state universities.
- The UP government and Niti Aayog reviewed progress on the 'UP @2047 Vision Document' with a coordinated action plan. A joint expert team and high-power committee will oversee its finalisation.
